


A SIERRA JOURNEY TO MONO LAKE - A SOLO EXHIBIT



Zenaida Mott, more affectionately known as "Zee Zee", grew up hiking and backpacking with her family. An early respect she learned for the land and its wildlife, along with the need to help preserve the remaining "wild places." The Ansel Adams Gallery at Mono Lake, situated in its own preserve of wild landscapes, has arranged the exhibit "A Sierra Journey" beginning September 23rd and each week through October 29th. The show features recent oil paintings from Yosemite to Lake Tahoe. The solo exhibit focuses on the natural wonders of the Eastern Sierra. Overlooking a fabulous view of Mono Lake, visitors may view the paintings Wednesday through Monday or by appointment by calling 760/647-6581.

This Autumn, Zee Zee will journey in association with The Conservancy Painters, whose proceeds will help benefit The Nature Conservancy and the Trust For Public Land. She believes

in "the preservation of the remaining open space and wilderness". This has been "a major concern as well as the primary influence and inspiration for her paintings. Zee Zee hopes that some of the love she has for these areas is transferred to her canvases. Previous shows include exhibits at Yosemite National Park, Virginia City, Jackson Hole, Wyoming, New England, Africa and Japan, in addition to many locations in California.
